



AUTOMATED CRIME SCENE CORRELATION

{a tool for law enforcement agencies}

Automated Crime Scene Correlation (ACSC) is an integrated part of VeriTracks. ACSC allows supervising and law enforcement agencies to work together maintaining a high level of public safety.

HOW ACSC WORKS

Each night VeriTracks receives data on reported crimes from the local law enforcement agency's records management system. ACSC then automatically compares the movements of GPS-monitored enrollees with the location of reported crimes. Whenever enrollees are in the vicinity of a reported crime, ACSC automatically ranks the strength of the correlation based on the length of time the enrollee was there and the time of the reported crime.

ACSC generates a report listing all of the correlations and rankings. VeriTracks emails the report to the designated supervising officer(s) and law enforcement personnel each morning. This tool saves law enforcement personnel investigative

hours by compiling a list of viable suspects who were in the vicinity of a crime and around the time it happened. ACSC is available at no additional cost to supervising and law enforcement agencies.

ADDITIONAL SURVEILLANCE TOOL

Law enforcement personnel can also use VeriTracks to enhance their surveillance of criminal activity hot spots with the creation of global zones. They create a zone around a specific geographic region, such as a suspected drug trafficking area, to watch for the presence of monitored enrollees. When any enrollee in VeriTracks enters this zone, this information is emailed to the law enforcement personnel.

TRAINING

STOP provides ACSC training to supervising officers and law enforcement personnel at no additional charge. Online self-paced training topics are also available and accessible as often as needed at any time of the day or night.

ACSC HIGHLIGHTS

- Automatically generates a list of viable suspects based on the movements of enrollees and the location of reported crimes.
- Suspect list is ranked based on the time of day and length of stay in the vicinity of the crime.
- Additional means of surveillance for designated high crime areas.
- Supervising agency maintains control over enrollee monitoring data.
- Training and access are provided at no cost to either the law enforcement or supervising agency.
